The Association of Episcopal Colleges, the US Chapter of the Colleges and Universities of the Anglican Communion (CUAC), will award one scholarship per year to assist a graduating senior of an Episcopal school (which has active membership in the National Association of Episcopal Schools), who is accepted to and will begin studies at one of the Episcopal Colleges in the United States (listed above).

These scholarships will recognize students who have been active Episcopalians both in their school and in their home parish. Applicants must be able to demonstrate a strong record of academic achievement in their junior and senior years, outstanding leadership, and a commitment to worship and community life in their school and parish.

Community service and social justice outreach are especially recognized.

The amount awarded to each student will be \$1,200 for the first year and renewable each year that the student remains in good standing at the student's Episcopal college for a total of up \$4,800 for four years for each student.

Applicants should submit to the CUAC office a letter of application and a completed application form (available online at www.cuac.org) and request letters of recommendation from the head of the applicant's school, from the student's home parish rector, and from one of the faculty who has taught the applicant. The applicant also should request that a current transcript be sent to the CUAC office. Applications must be received by January 1.

Decisions about awards will take by February 1. CUAC will inform each recipient of the scholarship award and inform the school. Each scholarship award recipient must be accepted and matriculate at the Episcopal School listed in her or his application.

Upon matriculation, a scholarship award will be prepared by the CUAC office and made payable to the Episcopal college for tuition or residence fees. In order to receive the scholarship in subsequent years, the college will be asked to send a letter each year notifying CUAC that the student remains enrolled, has made satisfactory academic progress, and is in good standing behaviorally.
